

Community Sponsorships and Partners

Arkansas Minority Health Commission

In 2022, Arkansas Health & Wellness partnered with the Arkansas Minority Health Commission (AMHC) to provide wellness resources, education, and COVID-19 support. Our Community Outreach Representatives attended over 80 outreach events and helped serve 1,733 community members.

AMHC services included screenings for COVID-19, blood pressure, cholesterol, glucose, A1C, HIV, height, weight, and BMI. AMHC followed up with patients who had abnormal results and shared county-level resources to help them get additional care.

AMHC's goal is to help create equitable access to healthcare and prevent diseases and conditions affecting minority populations in the state.

The American Heart Association funds more medical research related to heart disease and stroke than almost any other organization, second only to the federal government. By coordinating educational programs in the community and harnessing the power of grassroots advocacy, they demonstrate ways to improve the health of individuals while ensuring policies are in place that make it easier for Arkansans to adopt healthy behaviors.





A longtime supporter of these efforts, our Arkansas health plan sponsored Go Red for Women, the Central Arkansas Heart Walk, and the Central Arkansas Heart Ball in 2022. Go Red for Women is a national movement that educates women about the warning signs of heart disease and stroke and empowers them to improve their heart health. According to the association, cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in women, causing one in three deaths each year. The Central Arkansas Heart Walk brings together teams of walkers to fundraise and share a day of healthy activity. With the option for each team to set its own contribution targets, individual fundraising goals and corporate team goals amplify the power of individual gifts, funding research that leads to longer, healthier lives. The Central Arkansas Heart Ball features live and silent auctions. It also honors the rising class of Central Arkansas Sweethearts, high school sophomore girls who participate in education and volunteer activities throughout the year. The ball serves as a celebration following an ambitious year of fundraising, bringing together donors, heart and stroke experts, and community leaders.


2022 Community Events and Stats

Baby Showers


As COVID-19 gathering restrictions eased, we found ourselves able to host baby showers for our members again. In 2022, we hosted several showers across Central Arkansas to provide expecting parents helpful information regarding prenatal, delivery, and postnatal care. Members who attended also received door prizes such as diapers, wipes, onesies, pack and plays, and car seats.















Pine Bluff, AR

The Pine Bluff baby shower was the first large event of the year where we had the chance to celebrate our expecting Ambetter members. The event was focused on education, providing free resources, and partnership with local vendors to support expecting members.

During the event, we welcomed an obstetrician and a pediatrician to speak, played several games, and shared a space for people to get to know one another.

Conway, AR

In November 2022, the Arkansas Health & Wellness team hosted a baby shower for Conway Ambetter members at the Willow Event Center.

These events provide education and community resources for our pregnant members, including speakers, information packets, and giveaways to promote and support prenatal health. Nurse Case Managers were also on hand to answer any questions members might have.

Community Health Fairs

In 2022, our Community Outreach team hosted two community health fairs in Little Rock and Springdale. Each fair included 25 vendors who helped provide vaccines, preventive care, and screenings for vision, dental, and hearing. The fairs also included mental health and substance abuse providers.







Healthy Connections Clinic

As we continued to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic, Arkansas Total Care found ways to support the vaccination effort. We also helped provide information about additional wellness and community resources, as well as member support. In 2022, our Outreach team coordinated over 40 events at the 16 Healthy Connections clinic sites across the state. Our team provided timely vaccine information to members of our vulnerable community about the benefits of getting a COVID-19 vaccine or booster shot.

To support efforts beyond education, Arkansas Total Care sponsored several community vaccination events. These events served to inform community members about the benefits of getting a COVID-19 vaccine or booster shot. They also helped disprove myths surrounding the vaccines.

Autism Walk

In November, Arkansas Total Care sponsored an Autism Involves Me (AIM) walk event. AIM seeks to increase inclusiveness and resources for families raising children with autism. The organization started as a small parent support group and has become a cornerstone in Northwest Arkansas. AIM's mission is to empower and support families who are impacted by autism by promoting inclusivity and acceptance through advocacy. With AIM, we are helping to create a world where people with autism are celebrated.

Resources include information on early intervention providers, therapy clinics, respite programs, medical needs, applied behavior analysis clinics, and birth injury support. Programs include grants to help offset some of the financial burden that a family incurs while also being beneficial to the individual with autism; grants to help support teachers and therapists in local public schools as they serve children with special needs; events that focus on families being included in social adventures while connecting with others; and educational conferences for parents, caregivers, and educators that cover a wide array of topics surrounding care for people with autism.

Donations help provide basic supplies, therapeutic supplies, classroom tools, curricula, and sensory-sensitive events that allow children and their families to enjoy a safe, judgment-free experience that they might not have access to otherwise.

United Cerebral Palsy of Arkansas (UCP) works to help people with cerebral palsy and other disabilities, supporting the families and communities involved. UCP serves children and adults across Arkansas, offering the resources and assistance needed to help these individuals live without limitations.

Volunteer Champion Program Our employees have the ability to take part in a multitude of volunteer opportunities to help Arkansas live better. By participating in fundraisers, charitable giving, food pantries, wellness programs, and so much more, our company has continued to support and give back to our community in a helpful and meaningful way.

Each year, health plan employees can receive up to eight hours of paid time off to volunteer at any 501(c)(3) organization registered in the state of Arkansas. We partner with a number of organizations that have open volunteer opportunities for both groups and individuals.

Stewpot

In 2022, a group of Care Coordinators dedicated time to volunteer at the Stewpot in Little Rock on the first Wednesday of each month. The Stewpot's mission is simple: "Feed whoever comes through the door. "Feed whoever comes through the door. No questions asked."

No questions asked." Their goal is to provide diners with a meal, plus snacks for the rest of the day. Our volunteers help prepare and distribute the food as well as make financial contributions. They feed about 150 people each day.





The Crisis Intervention Center

A few members of our team volunteered with the Crisis Intervention Center in Fort Smith. The Crisis Intervention Center offers a safe space for survivors of domestic abuse, sexual assault, and human trafficking. They have a residential facility equipped to hold 30 adults at a time with their children. They help with professional services for physical exams, counseling, job placement, and locating housing. This location serves the need for temporary housing while they help locate everything their clients need to move forward and be successful. The Center's services are free for individuals. Our team wrapped gifts for the children in the Crisis Intervention Center and assembled gift bags for the parents. It was a wonderful way to support an organization that supports survivors.

























Arkansas Foodbank

In December, Arkansas Health & Wellness team members gathered at the Arkansas Foodbank to volunteer their time and efforts in eliminating food insecurity in Arkansas. Our volunteers sorted and cleared many pallets of food into 20-pound boxes and packaged them up to be shipped to food pantries all over the state. The Foodbank kept filling the warehouse while the team kept emptying it back out.

The mission of the Arkansas Foodbank is to strengthen the community by making sure hunger needs are met with sufficient access to nutritious food. We have been a longtime partner of the Arkansas Foodbank and were excited to continue the tradition of volunteering for them.

City Connection Donation

In 2022, Arkansas Health & Wellness donated \$10,000 to City Connections in sponsorship of their September Food Packing Party.

City Connections is a faith-based, nonprofit organization dedicated to uniting the Central Arkansas area by cultivating partnerships to aid in building a stronger community. They help bring people of faith together to serve and multiply impact through active service.

With the \$10,000 donation from Arkansas Health & Wellness, City Connections was able to acquire the necessary ingredients and supplies to make over 28,000 servings of food and refill the food pantry shelves at their 86 distribution partner locations throughout Central Arkansas. This donation will directly impact children and senior citizens in the community who struggle with food insecurity and lack access to nutrient-rich foods.

Junior Achievement

In April, QualChoice employees participated in the Junior Achievement of Arkansas (JA) Turkey Bowl fundraiser benefitting JA's student entrepreneurship program. JA helps young people by creating programs that help connect what they learn in school with life outside the classroom. The organization helps them gain a better understanding of how the world works, how to invest in their futures, and how to pursue their dreams.



Arkansas Gives Back 2022 Fall Charitable Campaign

In September, Arkansas Health & Wellness and Arkansas Total Care's Outreach teams participated in the Arkansas Gives Back fundraising initiative. Through this initiative, employees across the company were given the opportunity to donate funds to be used in support of two local charities: Community Health Centers of Arkansas (CHCA) and Arkansas Rural Health Partnership (ARHP). Employees across the health plans came together and donated over \$1,800 to these causes.

CHCA is a nonprofit organization that has helped expand access to affordable and quality care in Arkansas for more than 40 years. Funding is put toward providing training and technical assistance for community health centers to improve delivery of care.




